The service begins with a lighted candle, named Love, on a map of the world, bread and wine, and the first scene on the triptych. There is reflective Christmas music.

Leader On Christmas Eve we pause to prepare our hearts as we revisit the manger, at Bethlehem. At a still point in the turning world, we ask that we may be ready to receive God's gift of Jesus with fresh wonder. The pictures that make up this year's triptych represent three fruits of the Spirit that were revealed uniquely in Jesus: Love, Joy, and Peace. During this communion service we focus on the first of these, Love.

Psalm 136 1-6

God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life.

See what great love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God! And that is what we are! The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him. Dear friends, now we are children of God, and what we will be, has not yet been made known. But we know that when Christ appears, we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is.

This is how we know what love is: Jesus Christ laid down his life for us. And we ought to lay down our lives for our brothers and sisters. If anyone has material possessions and sees a brother or sister in need but has no pity on them, how can the love of God be in that person? Dear children, let us not love with words or speech but with actions and in truth.

Triptych One: Love

Message

Love is often represented in the shape of a heart, and coloured red.

Using red, the first part of the triptych depicts a rising sun. It is the promise of the dawn or "dayspring" in which we see God's love in real, human form.

And the Holy Spirit is active, portrayed in the shape of a dove.

The birth of Jesus is only fully understood if we see it as God's gift to the world, motivated by His love.

And this takes us into God's very heart and being. God is love.

God is unique (unlike anything or anyone else). His love is unique because of its height, length, depth and breadth.

The psalm we read urges us to give thanks because His love endures for ever. Unconditional love that has no end.

[&]quot;Unto us a child is born; unto us a Son is given."

[&]quot;God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son."

God is also unique in that He exists in three persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit, who are in perfect harmony: the supreme example of how to relate to one another in love.

Christmas involves each of these persons...

It is God who made the greatest gift of all time, simply because of love.

It is the Holy Spirit who is the Go-Between, through whom the Baby is conceived.

It is the Son who comes down to earth from heaven to be born as one of

Before Jesus came, during His life, and from then on, they continue to live and work in perfect harmony.

Jesus came to reveal God to us, and to teach us God's way of living: humble, forgiving, tender and full of grace. And as we receive God's gift of Jesus, and are forgiven through the death of our Saviour, Jesus, the Spirit helps tender shoots to grow and in time produce fruit.

And first of these fruits is Love. We know what true love is only through Jesus. And as He lives in us, His love stirs within us, until by God's Spirit, we are enabled to love as He loved us.

All through the Jewish Scriptures people longed for the Promised, the Anointed One, the embodiment of God's unfailing, enduring love.

And we are among the privileged ones to know the name of this promised one, Jesus Christ. What's more we discover that He longs for us to be part of His family: Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

And the greatness of God's love is revealed when Jesus and the Spirit encourage us to talk to God as our Father: Abba, Daddy. It could not be a closer or more personal love.

Those who dare to pause, never get over God's love. Think of the state of the world tonight: why does God not intervene and call an end to suffering? We cannot reason an answer, but we know that in the end it is all about His love: he is compassionate, very slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love.

But we do not have to look far to understand God's love. Those of us who are willing to lay open the depths of our beings, our minds, thoughts and hearts, before God, acknowledge that our feelings are mixed, sometimes murky. Why should He love us enough to make the gift of His beloved Son, Jesus?

We wonder at His mercy and grace in forgiving us through the death of His beloved Son. We, who caused His pain, are welcomed to the family table. That is what true love is.

And so, this evening as we contemplate the baby in a manger, with the bread and wine, as signs of the death of Jesus, thirty-three years later, we do so with wonder. Amazing love, how can it be?

And as the Spirit works in us, something of that love, His love works through us and into our relationships with others.

A Christmas Carol is a story of change or conversion prompted by Christmas. May Scrooge's story be ours even if not quite so dramatically and suddenly.

Candles are lit from the Bethlehem candle and placed on different parts of the world. The location, and one or more of the extended family associated with that place, are named so that we can pray for them together in the silence.

Declaring our Faith
