Thought for Boxing Day Triptych Three: Peace

The third picture is about Peace. The scene looks the same, with fields and stars, but it could be anywhere in the world. You can see a dove, and there are children in the foreground. They are from different parts of the world. And they are holding hands as they look up at the stars and the dove.

One of the names given to Jesus was the Prince of Peace. He came to save and rescue the world and to bring peace that no one else could give. He showed us how to live at peace with each other. He died to bring peace between us and God. Most of us know that he died on a cross. That's why there is a cross in the first picture. It was God's way of putting us right with him: friends again. Through trusting what Jesus did for us on the Cross, it opens the way for us to be friends with others, even those it difficult to like or forgive.

When we are right with God and with others, then there can be true peace. The dove represents the bringing of peace to the world in Jesus.

Tonight, the world needs peacemakers very much, perhaps even more than it did last Christmas, and as we join hands with others, we can be peacemakers.
